


GOULDING COMMUNITY CENTRE ENCAMPMENT UPDATE

Toronto Public Health reminds residents to take precautions against West

WEST NILE VIRUS PRECAUTIONS

Nile virus this summer. With mosquito season upon us, Toronto Public Health (TPH) advises residents

to take steps to protect themselves from West Nile virus (WNV) - an illness transmitted through the bite of an infected mosquito. In 2023, there were 23 confirmed human cases of West Nile virus in Toronto. Residents can take steps to avoid bites from infected mosquitos:

- Wear light-coloured clothing, long pants and long-sleeved shirts when outdoors
- Apply insect repellent approved by Health Canada by following the manufacturer's instructions: https://www.canada.ca/en/healthcanada/services/about-pesticides/insect-repellents.html
- Ensure windows and doors have tight-fitting screens • Remove standing water from properties or items where mosquitos can

Cover up during peak mosquito hours at dusk and dawn

- breed such as pool covers, buckets, planters, toys and your Blue Bin, Green Bin and Garbage Bins Keep grass cut short and trim bushes and trees around properties.
- WNV symptoms usually start to show between two and 14 days after a person is bitten by an infected mosquito and may include:

 headache nausea

vomiting

fever

- body aches skin rash
- swollen lymph glands.
- Older individuals or people with compromised immune systems are at higher risk of severe illness. Residents experiencing serious symptoms or who have


Each summer, TPH conducts mosquito surveillance using 22 traps placed across the city, collecting samples weekly for identification and WNV testing. In 2023, 83 mosquito pools tested positive for WNV.



Currently, the city's employment areas enjoy special protections. For the City's Employment Areas to continue to benefit from special protections,

OPA 680, in combination with other official plan changes, will help to ensure the City's Employment Areas are protected over the long term and maintain their economic viability. You are invited by the City Planning Division to join virtual Community Consultation Meetings on Tuesday, June 25 at 6:00pm or Thursday, July 4 at 10:30am (to register, click either link). The purpose of this meeting is to consult with residents and businesses in North York on the Avenues Policy Review initiative, which is one part of the **Housing Action Plan** (HAP).

The HAP is a cornerstone of the City's efforts to address current housing challenges. Adopted by City Council in December 2022, the HAP outlines a strong 'made-in-Toronto' multi-pronged approach to increase housing supply,

housing choice and affordability for current and future residents. To help accomplish these goals, the HAP directed City staff to find ways to accelerate the supply of housing by examining and removing policy barriers to new housing. Through the Avenues Policy Review, City Planning staff are

looking at opportunities to:

- 1. update the vision and policy direction for how Avenues will develop;
- 2. extend and potentially introduce new Avenues;
- 3. streamline study requirements for building new housing along Avenues; and
- 4. consider opportunities to create areas of transition between Avenues and Neighbourhoods to enable more housing.


