Shots Fired near Senlac and Finch

We were alarmed to receive the following update from 32 Division: Shots Fired - Thursday August 15, 2024 - 11:50 PM Finch Avenue West and Senlac Road - Police 32 Division

At approximately 11:50 p.m., Toronto Police Service responded to a call for a firearm discharge in the Finch Avenue West and Senlac Road area. A complainant had reported hearing the sound of several gunshots in the area. When officers arrived on the scene, they located several shell casings and bullet holes in a nearby residence. No injuries were reported. No arrests have been made. The investigation is ongoing.

Those who live in the area who feel traumatized by this situation can contact our office and we will share some resources that have been provided to us by Toronto Police. It is upsetting to know that weapons are being discharged in our neighbourhood. It is a reminder of the great risks our officers take to run towards calls about gunshots. Please reach out to the police if you have any information to share regarding this incident.

I know many of our residents are struggling with the growing number of encampments in our city. There were encampments in front of my hotel in Halifax and many representatives from cities across Canada shared about their struggles. Clearly, this problem is larger than our city and requires the resources and efforts of our higher levels of government.



DOUGLAS SNOW AQUATIC CENTRE: SCHEDULE CHANGE

Starting **Tuesday, September 3, 2024**, the **Douglas Snow Aquatic Centre** will introduce a new pool schedule, incorporating both 50-metre and 25-metre formats.

Due to challenges with the bulkhead used to transition between formats, which has led to potential damage and safety concerns, the new schedule aims to minimize bulkhead movement and enhance safety.

This adjustment, developed with input from local aquatic clubs and schools, may also allow for additional programs. Updates have been communicated to patrons through posted signs, handouts, and an online "Service Alert," with the new schedule available above.






LEGAL WORKSHOP: HOUSING AND TENANT'S RIGHTS

If you're unable to attend in person, a virtual option through Zoom is also available at the same time. Please feel free to bring the entire family, and invite those you believe would benefit from this information!




