UTILITY WORK AT YONGE ST. AND STEELES AVE. (STEELES STATION)

To support the Yonge North Subway Extension Project (YNSE), Beanfield will complete the relocation of the existing fibre optic cable on the south side of

Steeles Ave., crossing over Yonge St. This work is necessary as the existing cable conflicts with the future Steeles Station North Headwall.

The work will be done on the boulevard on Steeles Ave. from Tangreen Crt. to Bayview Ave., with eastbound lane closures on Steeles Ave. during this

period. The relocation of the Beanfield cable is being integrated into a larger Beanfield capital project that will result in network enhancement. As Metrolinx's

work is being integrated into an existing worksite within the current timing of 8am - 5pm and 9pm - 6am, residents and businesses near the work should not experience any additional disruptions. The existing traffic impacts, including rotating closures of portions of the boulevard and parallel lane in the project area will continue. Signage will be posted as required as part of the Traffic Control Plan.


FINCH STATION ELEVATOR REPAIRS



The City of Toronto has implemented a new regulatory framework for multi-

tenant (rooming) houses. Changes include permitting multi-tenant houses city-wide, improving oversight and compliance and preserving affordable, safer homes for tenants.

As of March 31, it is mandatory for all operators of multi-tenant houses across Toronto to obtain a license. Preserving tenancies and preventing evictions is central to the City's approach. Implemented over a three-year period, the City will gradually expand licensing and include an education-first approach to obtaining compliance. The City will also prioritize educating tenants about their rights and ensure a range of supports are in place for tenants in need.






