Vacant Home Tax Improvement Needed

This past week my team and I noticed a large crowd growing in the Revenue Services area at North York Civic Centre. As we spoke to the seniors, we realized many residents had not filed their home occupancy status and had been billed for the vacant home tax, despite living in their homes. It has been upsetting to see the stress and emotional impact on our residents who have been shocked to receive a large vacant home tax bill for a home in which they currently reside. We heard from some seniors that they lost sleep because of this.

Seven of my staff team set up tables alongside city staff to alleviate the pressure of hundreds of residents waiting in line at North York Civic Centre. I am grateful for their willingness to drop everything they were doing to support everyone at North York Civic Centre to get faster support.

Change is difficult and residents and city staff are on a learning curve. That being said, our communications before and after this situation have been lacking. I have spent the past couple of days advocating for the following:

- A review of what happened to identify learnings towards establishing a better process including a stronger communications plan
- Waive and/or refund all late fees
- Ask the city to consider using water bills to determine occupancy instead of requiring an annual declaration

It has been confirmed that the late fees will be waived and/or reimbursed. If you haven't done so yet, please do not pay it.

I would like to apologize for the stress this caused. I will be strongly advocating for a better process for next year!

Amidst the busyness...a statement revision

A final statement on protests happening in the city was released on my behalf yesterday that did not align fully with my sentiments. The letter was edited multiple times, and unfortunately, we did not have the opportunity to review the final version. We did NOT endorse the final version. Additionally, I've been working beyond my capacity in recovery from surgery. Upon further reflection and dialogue with community members, I would like to issue my statement that differs from my colleagues. [Click Here](#) to read.

SOLAR ECLIPSE GUIDANCE

On **Monday, April 8**, North America will experience a solar eclipse. **This is a rare event where the moon passes between the sun and the earth, casting a shadow on the earth's surface.** While Toronto falls outside the path of a total solar eclipse, **a partial eclipse will occur at 3:19 p.m.**, lasting approximately one minute. Precautions are required for the entire duration of the eclipse, from 2:04 p.m. to 4:31 p.m.:

- **Do not look directly at the sun**
- **Do not look indirectly at the sun using a mirror, or through a window**
- **Where possible, schedule tasks indoors for the duration of the eclipse**

For tasks that must continue outdoors, including driving:

- **Avoid looking directly at the sun**
- **Continue to follow existing safety controls**
- **Use hats or visors that do not allow light to pass through**
- **Slow down and stay focused on your surroundings**
- **Turn on headlights and approach all crosswalks, intersections and transit stops with caution as people and objects on the road may be harder to see**

LIGHTS OUT TORONTO

To protect birds during their migration during the spring and autumn months, the City of Toronto has launched the "**Lights Out Toronto**" campaign – a city-wide campaign to address the issue of migratory bird collisions with building windows in Toronto during the spring (**April 1 to May 31**) and fall (**September 1 to October 31**) migration seasons.

The City's campaign encourages the public to contribute to "Lights Out Toronto" by **turning off unnecessary lights** – defined as lighting not intended for security or safety reasons – during the nighttime, to reduce fatal bird collisions with buildings. By turning off non-essential lights in buildings, Toronto can be a leader in reducing the number of bird collisions and saving countless bird lives.

As part of the "Lights Out Toronto" campaign, Toronto residents and businesses are encouraged to:

- **Turn off interior lighting at night, especially on higher floors.**
- **Close window coverings at night if lights must be kept on.**
- **Turn off exterior decorative lighting, pot lights and flood lights when not in use.**
- **Substitute strobe lighting and reduce atrium lighting whenever possible.**
- **Install automatic motion sensors and controls wherever possible.**

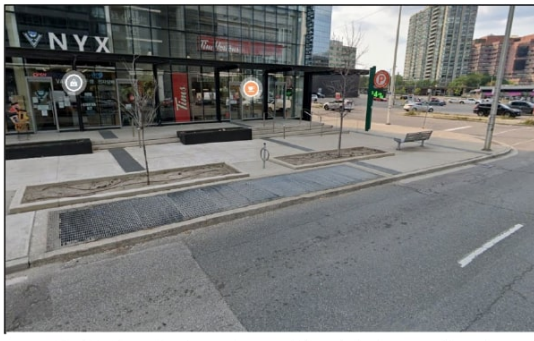

What we are doing and why

The TTC is in the process of rehabilitating its ventilation shaft on Yonge Street between Poyntz Avenue and Bogert Avenue. To date the majority of the work has been underground.

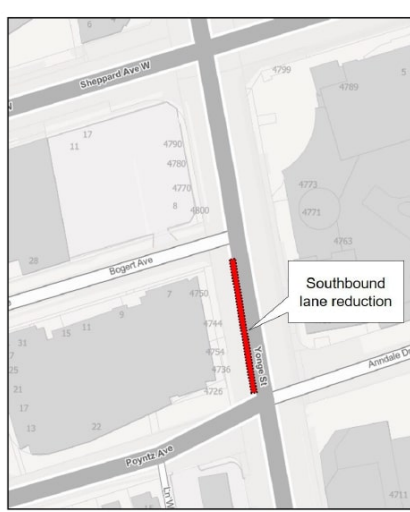


Ventilation shaft on Yonge Street, between Poyntz Avenue and Bogert Avenue.

On **Sunday, April 14**, there will be a concrete pour to support ongoing activities. Trucks will be positioned at street-level on Yonge Street between Poyntz Avenue and Bogert Avenue. This work will require a temporary lane reduction on Yonge Street through the work area.

Motorist, cyclist, and pedestrian impacts

- The southbound curb lane on Yonge Street between Poyntz Avenue and Bogert Avenue will be closed during work hours.
- Motorists and cyclists travelling southbound through the area will be required to merge.
- All sidewalks, pedestrian crossings, and access to nearby properties will be maintained.



Equipment

- Concrete trucks and crews will be present at street-level.
- Noise and dust associated with typical construction can be expected. Efforts will be made to keep levels to a minimum.

Work hours

- The concrete truck activity will take place between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.
- To create a safe work zone, crews may set up/remove traffic controls a few hours before and after the scheduled work activity.

VENTILATION SHAFT REPAIR NOTICE

The TTC is in the process of rehabilitating its ventilation shaft on **Yonge Street between Poyntz Avenue and Bogert Avenue**. To date the majority of the work has been underground.

On **Sunday, April 14**, concrete trucks are scheduled to support work crews and will be positioned at street-level on Yonge Street between Poyntz Avenue and Bogert Avenue. **This activity will require a temporary lane reduction on Yonge Street through the work area**. The concrete pouring is the only expected work activity on April 14 and will only occur **between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.**

This activity will require a temporary southbound lane reduction on Yonge Street through the work area between Poyntz and Bogert avenues. The traffic controls will be lifted as soon as this work activity is completed for the day.






