Dear Neighbour,

November 15 marks one year since I officially entered Toronto City Hall. It has been a beautiful, challenging, exciting and often daunting whirlwind. I still remember that first day, getting keys to my office, sitting down with my newly hired team and mapping out our journey together as best we could. We started with no digital infrastructure or knowledge of work in progress. Luckily, I enjoy a good challenge and the team that joined me has proven to be a great mix of intelligence, dedication and grit! Here are some questions I am often asked:

Was it everything you thought it would be? My highest goal has always been to empower residents of Willowdale to participate in an accessible democracy towards building a better community. The surprise challenge has been the amount of time spent serving on boards and committees that impact the entire city, due in part to the faith in me shown by both the current and previous mayors who have placed me on numerous committees. I am always juggling citywide responsibilities with my commitment to our community.

Is it fun? Yes! Watching the community come together in beautiful ways such as Avondale movie night, dancing with the the Iranian community and our first night market. Although most days are filled with many meetings and challenges, it is gratifying to try to piece together a complex puzzle to solve problems and effect positive change.

IRANIAN CULTURAL DISTRICT

To officially recognize the history and contributions of Iranians in shaping the Iranian neighbourhood in Willowdale that is famous in Iran, I moved a motion to recognize the Iranian community through a symbolic naming of a section of Yonge Street, between Cummer Ave. and Steeles Ave. To achieve this, we need to gather your suggestions through an online survey.

Highlighting the Iranian cultural identity and presence will strengthen local businesses and grow public awareness. In an effort to further support local culture, the City of Toronto is developing an exciting NEW Cultural Districts Program. As a result of my motion, the City is now exploring the feasibility of planning and developing a portion of Yonge Street as the Cultural District for Iranians. INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE

Toronto Council joined 30 municipalities in declaring gender-based violence and intimate partner violence (IPV) an epidemic at its July 2023 meeting. Council adopted my amendment to add community organizations serving victims of IPV and the Toronto Police Services to the stakeholders collaborating to action this declaration. I am honoured to have been appointed by Mayor Chow to lead the process of creating an IPV Action Plan for Toronto. Currently I am meeting with City staff to review IPV work being done and community organization leaders to identify gaps and how to best support victims and prevent IPV through an Action Plan for Toronto.

YONGE STREET FOOT PATROL

In response to many concerns raised at our Community Safety Townhall along with issues we shared from residents, 32 Division (our local police division) launched a Yonge Street Foot Patrol this past summer. The 4member team that is rotated in pairs actively patrols the area from Beecroft Rd. to Doris Ave., Sheppard Ave. to just north of Finch Ave. They handle crime, disorder, and Vision Zero road safety, working in tandem with emergency response officers. The team has been successful in assisting with arrests on the street following reports as well as managing noise and disturbances in public spaces. Many business owners and residents have expressed gratitude for their presence.

COUNCILLOR CHENG'S MOTIONS

Mayor Chow to ask Premier Ford to fully fund the design and construction of Cummer Station.

City Manager to examine the City's process improvement activities using business process review tools such as a lean six sigma lens and identify areas that could benefit from further continuous improvement.

City staff reviewing the feasibility of creating a community assets dashboard for the purpose of creating community-based data-driven insights to support data-based decision-making.

Search warrant procedures will soon require officers to consider children and vulnerable adults who are present during a search.

City to pause accessibility renovations at Willowdale Manor to explore all options to preserve well-loved features including the community stage and front sitting lounge area.

PARK UPDATES





MITCHELL FIELD COMMUNITY CENTRE

After serving the Willowdale community as a COVID-19 vaccine clinic for over 2 years, we were thrilled to reopen Mitchell Field earlier this year. Fall Recreation Programs started October 2, 2023. New programs include: Martial Arts, Line Dancing, Art Classes and Instructional Volleyball.

This park is slated for a re-fresh. We hosted a Brunch Potluck Consultation in partnership with Silverview Neighbourhood Association. Community engagement has been conducted in English, Korean, Farsi, and Chinese to maximize diverse participation. There will be further opportunities to share your input.

TRANSIT & INFRASTRUCTURE



CUMMER STATION CAMPAIGN

WILLOWDALE PARK

Willowdale Park is a cherished neighborhood gem, enjoyed by many. We are planning a visionary upgrade as a central park in our community. This can only happen with the participation of those who use the park. While some virtual consultations have taken place in the past, we strongly believe that inperson interaction will yield more engagement and more inclusive results. Stay tuned for upcoming opportunities to get involved.

CONACHER PARK

The existing basketball court in Conacher Park will be relocated due to Toronto Hydro work on their land. I requested that the court be relocated within the park. Construction is scheduled to commence Spring 2024.

NEWTONBROOK COMMUNITY RECREATION CENTRE

The City is planning to build a new two-storey multi-use community centre as part of the new M2M development at Yonge and Cummer. Since it is a developer-delivered project, the developer has submitted the Site Plan Application for the entire development, including the community centre, and is currently awaiting approval. The construction start is anticipated for 2024.

BIKE SHARE

Due to advocacy from my office, Bike Share Toronto expedited the installation of a station in the north east corner of Yonge St. and Bishop Ave. Willowdale has also received approval for an e-bike charging station at 19 Glendora Ave. next to an upcoming on-street EV charger. Installation is expected by mid-November. A dozen more Bike Share stations are planned that will contribute greatly to transportation options for Willowdale residents and visitors.



YONGE STREET TRAGEDY (YST)

HOLMES PARK

The community enjoyed a fun grand-opening ceremony with live music and ice cream that served as a launching pad for consultation for the future park expansion that will see the park more than double in size. Many kids lingered on the play equipment thanks to the great design!



CASWELL PARK PLAYGROUND ENHANCEMENT

This project is a part of an ongoing citywide Playground Enhancement Program (PEP). Community engagement for this project will be completed by Dec 2023 and the playground will reopen by the end of 2024.

PICKLEBALL

Willowdale currently has 3 courts available for use: Moore Park (new for 2023), Wedgewood Park, and Lillian Park. Goulding Park will be added next!

HOUSING

ABANDONED HOUSES

Several residents have contacted us about abandoned homes which can create many challenges for neighbours including squatters starting fires, wild animals in the home as well as unkept property. If you suspect a home has been abandoned, here are the steps to take:

• Work with neighbours to keep an eye on the home. If there are wild animals in the home or property issues call 311. If you see illegal activity or squatters, please call the police non-emergency line at 416-808-2222.

2 Report the abandoned home to our office and we will alert city departments to activate an investigation. Please share all Service Request Numbers (SR#) for every complaint you have filed with 311.

175 CUMMER AVENUE

The Ontario Land Tribunal appeal for 175 Cummer Avenue for the proposed Modular Supportive Housing project happened November 1st to 3rd. At the time of publication of this newsletter we do not know the outcome of the hearing. You can find out from my email newsletter or visit: www.lilycheng.ca

In my campaign platform, I promised I would fight for Cummer Station. My motion to prepare a business case to be presented by our Mayor to the Premier passed! The voices of our community have been amplified! Advocacy highlights include:

In an email to CBC Toronto on October 12, 2023 the Ontario Ministry of Transportation said the province is working "collaboratively with the city to explore the possibility of including the additional station located at Cummer Avenue."

PERMANENT MEMORIAL

Location options are currently being determined. Once a location is set, a design contest will be launched. This will all be done with the participation of a YST Memorial Community Committee.

YONGE-401 RAMP

The Senior Project Manager is working on a joint agreement with MTO (Ministry of Transportation Ontario), with an RFP for Environmental Assessment set to be released by the end of the year.

DORIS EXTENSION

Due to a legal issue, the RFP for preliminary detailed design has been delayed and will be released soon.

REIMAGINE YONGE

The city is hiring a consultant towards engaging more residents to ensure robust participation in the design process. A Stakeholder Advisory Committee is still planned but contingent on the hiring of this consultant.

WILLOWDALE WELCOME CENTRE

The centre located at 5800 Yonge St. has transitioned back to being a refugee shelter and is currently hosting 410 refugees in two buildings. Approximately 75% of the residents are actively engaged in either work, education, or both. CITY OF TORONTO BUDGET & A NEW DEAL WITH THE PROVINCE

In a recent press conference with Mayor Chow, Premier Ford acknowledged, "Toronto is facing deep financial challenges that are no longer sustainable....We need governments to work together to deliver solutions that protect services, avoid new taxes and put the city on a path towards long-term financial sustainability. Simply put, Toronto needs a new deal." Our operating shortfall for 2023 was over \$933 million along with a \$9.5 billion state of good repair backlog. While a reserve fund covers the current operational shortfall, Toronto will be forced to significantly decrease spending as this reserve will be depleted unless a new deal is established. It will definitely be challenging as a member of the budget committee and the Toronto Police Service Budget Committee.

BUILDING WILLOWDALE

Over the past year I've attended over 40 meetings with developers to discuss their application proposals and plans. I make every effort to begin meeting with developers early in the application process (within 6 months of the submission of their plans) to maximize opportunities for community benefits as well as to ensure their vision aligns with our neighbourhood. I provide a one-sheet summarizing the major priorities I expect applications to address, including the following 8 core values:



Architecture that fosters neighbourly connectivity.



Onsite Community Benefits (daycares, affordable housing, and community spaces for community organizations and human services.)



Create or expand parks.



Safe Pick Up/Drop off zone for people and deliveries.



Prioritize Children and Pets (indoor playrooms/outdoor playgrounds for kids and dog runs for pets).



Commercial/retail on ground floor of high density applications to create 15-minute walkable neighbourhoods.



Market Driven Parking & Car Share **Availability**



Underground access for pedestrians from developments to subway stations where possible.
