# **Monday: Civic Appointments**

I spent Monday chairing the Civic Appointments Committee where we interviewed 25 candidates to choose 11 who will form the first Housing Rights Advisory Committee that has been established to ensure the interests of those who are precariously housed or facing homelessness and discrimination are reflected in our housing policy. Our interviews included vulnerable members of the community. As such, I am grateful we were able to provide a very approachable interview experience which included setting up a table with a tablecloth, small vase with flowers and a bowl of oranges that hopefully helped our prospective candidates feel welcome. This is certainly much better than where interviews typically happen at a formal committee table that includes computer screens and microphones. Moving forward, we may create a similar environment for all interviews as we want to ensure those who join our boards and committees reflect the diversity of our city.

being offered. The Confronting Anti-Black Racism Advisory Committee has spent 18 months along with the Yonge/Dundas Square Board and other stakeholders. They landed on renaming Yonge/Dundas Square, Yonge Dundas Station, Dundas West Station and Jane/Dundas library. The cost of this is considerably lower with only \$700K additional monies required, compared to the \$13 million that would have been spent to rename the entire street. The new name of

Yonge/Dundas Square will be **Sankofa Square**, a Ghanian word that means

Dundas. Councillor Moise moved a motion to pause the plan on Dundas St. and instead, rename some key city assets for which funding was already identified or

I am encouraged by this tremendous support of the mayor and council to continue advocating to the province to fully fund Cummer Station as part of their Yonge North Subway Extension plan. We will keep you updated on the province's response to our business case.

**Friday** City Council voted to <u>rename Centennial Stadium the Rob Ford Stadium</u>. Many councillors shared stirring speeches of the positive contributions of our former Mayor. Certainly he had a great reputation for showing up for his people. Due to the complexity of his legacy, I was unable to support this decision. However, moving forward, I will choose to remember the positive aspects of his leadership.

**Motion Win for Action on IPV!** I also moved a motion for the city to establish a working group with me to ensure greater alignment and collaboration between front line serving organizations and our internal departments that have purview on intimate

partner violence. Due to the complexity of the issue and the breadth of

departments that play a role, this is the first step we can take towards providing better support to victims and survivors of IPV.

#### **FLIP Kitchen Update**

Many community members have written to my office in support of the amazing food entrepreneurs that served delicious cuisine at the food incubator launched in 2022 at 5220 Yonge St. All of us were shocked to hear of their sudden eviction. I have been working with the Mayor's office and the Economic Development and Cultural Office to advocate for some financial support for these women who lost their source of income very suddenly. I'm happy to share that a motion was passed at council this week to reimburse these vendors from equity seeking groups, the rent they have paid during their tenancy. This will be a great support as they suddenly found themselves in a difficult transition.

FLIP Kitchen was launched in 2022 with an ambitious goal of supporting members of equity-seeking groups to launch food businesses. As we all know, the restaurant industry can be brutal, and unfortunately, this was experienced by our participants because they did not receive the support they hoped for when they applied for the program. This happened because the not-for-profit that was supposed to run the program was terminated early on, and the entrepreneurs were left to find their own way to survive. They were offered some outside which was not the support that they hoped to receive. There was no rent paid for

mentoring and services from the Toronto Small Business Enterprise Centre 2022 and I passed a motion for abated rent in 2023. Unfortunately, a not-forprofit to run the program was not brought online during that time and the courageous entrepreneurs continued to fight to establish themselves without direct support. As the contract and lease for a new operator selected through an RFP process,

Feed Scarborough, was solidified, all leases had to be transferred to the lead operator. This meant new leases had to be signed. Our group of entrepreneurs declined. I do not agree with how this unfolded and feel badly that this is the result. I am working with city staff to prevent this from happening in the second iteration of this space. Please do continue to follow our courageous and exhausted entrepreneurs as

some will be continuing to provide food through catering. Da Endz



#### YONGE NORTH SUBWAY EXTENSION ANNOUNCEMENT


The extension is moving forward with 5 new stations (Steeles Station, Clark Station, Royal Orchard Station, Bridge Station and High Tech Station) along an approximately 8 km route. The YNSE is one of the largest and most ambitious infrastructure projects in Canada and will put thousands of people and jobs in Vaughan, Markham, Richmond Hill and Toronto closer to rapid transit.

Metrolinx and Infrastructure Ontario evaluated submissions received through last spring's request for qualifications and shortlisted 3 teams to submit proposals for delivering the advance tunnel contract. CrossTransit Group, North End Connectors, and Toronto-York Tunnel Connectors have been selected. Within their proposals, teams will submit their plans for tunnel design and construction, financing, as well as tunnel boring machine delivery and underground station support works.

We are targeting to award the contract to the successful team in late 2024. Tunnelling work will begin after a detailed schedule is finalized, however construction of this project is already underway at Finch Station, where early upgrades to accommodate future subway service are nearing completion.

In Toronto, owners of residential properties must declare their occupancy status annually, even if they live there. The Vacant Home Tax (VHT) applies to properties not serving as the principal residence, occupied by tenants, or eligible for exemptions for six months or more in a calendar year. 



Project Area: A section of Ellerslie Avenue






