Hi Neighbour!

Thank you to all who came to say hi at our 1 year Anniversary Open House Party! It was great to see our diverse community come together. Several newcomers were especially excited to be able to come into our office and to feel like their representative can be so accessible, which is not always the case in many of their home countries.

I am so grateful for the meaningful Remembrance Day ceremony held at the

Cenotaph at York Cemetery (on Beecroft). It was both beautiful and honourable to take a moment together to remember the many sacrifices that have been made to protect our country, democracy and freedom. At a time when it feels like war and violence are multiplying, how precious is the life we get to live here in Canada. It was an honour to speak on behalf of the City of Toronto, to lay the wreath and to meet 102-year-old Veteran Ed Stafford. Thank you to the Governor General's Horse Guards, 32 Combat Engineer Regiment, 32 Service Battalion and all the cadet corps who attended. It was a very meaningful morning with many tears shed. We even received a fly over of vintage planes to mark the moment!

Warming Centre at Willowdale Baptist Church (WBC)

a warming centre at 15 Olive Ave. from November 15 to April 15 anytime the temperature goes below -5. This past week we held a stakeholders meeting for condo board representatives, business owners, and neighbourhood leaders from the surrounding area to discuss their concerns. Here are some takeaways from our meeting:

the warming centre. This is the first time volunteers are part of a warming centre implementation and I hope this can be expanded in the future to provide a supportive warm welcome to those who come into our midst to stay with us during the winter. We will be working on an intake system that supports the unhoused who

- currently reside in Willowdale to ensure they are prioritized for bed spaces before it is opened to the general public. The warming centre will have on-site 24/7 security in addition to a pair of
- Community Safety Staff who will be patrolling the surrounding area 24/7. The team is trained in de-escalation, identifies hot spots in their patrol and supports any unhoused residents in distress in the area, regardless of whether they are a client of the warming centre or not. When asked about the reason WBC is hosting the warming centre, Dawn,
- a representative from the church said, "We want to follow Jesus and be a welcoming place of love and compassion." Jane Farrow is the community engagement facilitator who can answer any
- questions or concerns: <u>WeatherResponseTO@gmail.com</u> • Jane and my team are working on an "FAQ" including a contact list for any questions or concerns that arise during the winter season.
- The warming centre is not a long term solution. The city is looking at expanding long term shelter infrastructure as well as deeply affordable
- housing. Both of these goals will take some time, so warming centres will still be in our suite of supports for the unhoused for the foreseeable future. We have approximately 9,183 shelter beds which are full on a nightly basis. Thus far in 2023, 4760 people have been moved into housing. Despite this success, there is also a growing population of refugees in our shelter system, which means we are still running out of shelter beds on a nightly basis. • One of the biggest needs for the unhoused is socks. Streets To Homes is asking if our community can help run a sock drive. Please let our office
- know if you are interested in helping run a sock drive. Yonge North York BIA AGM This past week the BIA held their AGM. It was a chance to reflect on the

successes, opportunities and challenges faced by businesses along our main strip. Office towers continue to struggle with growing vacancies, which means

there is great opportunity for affordable office space in our neighbourhood. The BIA has grown in visibility and impact. In addition to supporting the first ever night market in Willowdale, they also participated in many of the festivals that filled our square. The BIA will be launching an exciting Enchanted Lights Festival that will fill Mel Lastman Square with beautiful lights! We Love Willowdale Christmas Market and Walking Parade with FIRST **EVER Mel Lastman Square Christmas Tree Lighting!!!** Anyone who has attended the market in previous years can attest to the warmth

and festive spirit it brings. This market is unique in that it supports community vendors, some of whom would not necessarily have the means to have a booth at Mel Lastman Square without the support of NeighbourLink North York. This year, we will have the first Christmas Tree Lighting brought to us by the Yonge

North York BIA! There will be caroling, hot chocolate and lots of great opportunities to buy some special gifts! It will be especially beautiful to see all the lights filling up our square into the evening! I also met with the Toronto Alliance for the Performing Arts this week to discuss the importance of investing in the arts for the return generated, both in revenue and social benefits for the community. 

In response to the numerous speeding complaints received, divisional traffic

was charged with STUNT DRIVING and received a 30-day license suspension, and a 14-day car impoundment. Once convicted, they would receive 6 demerit points, a fine of \$2000 to \$10000, potential jail time, as well as loss of license for a minimum of 1 year.
