Dear Neighbour,

Thank you to NeighbourLink North York and Street Eats Market for kicking off the first ever Taste of North York this past weekend! It was a wonderful celebration of international food that reflected the diversity of our city. More importantly, people got a taste of our community through the beautiful performances along with the 25 community organizations that hosted booths to invite people to connect, participate or volunteer! From dancing with Earl Haig students' K-Pop Dancing, Willowdale schools Toronto Dance Salsa and Star Dance, Willowdale-based Rashmi Dance School's Indian dance performances, to local Willowdaler Helen Shumilova who brought Desna dancing to teach and present Ukranian dancing...and so much more! One of my favourite moments was dancing with our Iranian neighbours! It is truly wonderful to see the passion and diverse talents of our neighbourhood.

Many years ago I helped to co-found We Love Willowdale as a movement during the Yonge Street Tragedy. It was so exciting to see Mayor Olivia Chow holding up our "We Love Willowdale" T-Shirt and getting the crowd to yell in unison, "We Love Willowdale, We Love North York, We Love Toronto!" Let us keep these chants in our heart and not let the cynicism and polarization of politics overtake us!

Developing our Office Team and Infrastructure

When I ran to be city councillor I knew I could not serve such a large ward without a great team, infrastructure and processes. This has very much been a work in progress from day one. The city does not provide a case management or database system and we have had to try a few to figure out how we will best manage our cases and data.

I have an incredible team that reflects the diversity of our city. Each member is so passionate and dedicated. We took a short staff retreat this week to do some facilitated team-building and strategic planning. I stand in awe of this wonderful

group of people and am humbled by their support in serving not just Willowdale, but the entire city through my many committee responsibilities.

Toronto Police Services Board

Yesterday we welcomed Deputy Mayor Morley to the Police Board and await Councillor Burnside who will join us at the next meeting.

During our meeting we discussed the different pathways that have been developed within the Police Service and by our city to better support our community including:

- 1. Gerstein 9-1-1 Crisis Call Diversion Pilot. This program situates a crisis worker in the TPS Communications Call Centre that can provide an option of support to those calling in or officers on the field.
- 2. Mobile Crisis Intervention Team (MCIT). Mental health nurses and a specially trained police officer work together on 9-1-1 calls involving individuals experiencing a mental health crisis.
- 3. **Toronto Community Crisis Service (TCCS)**. The service (run by the City of Toronto) provides an alternative to police enforcement, creating a community-based, client-centred, trauma-informed response to non-emergency crisis calls and wellness checks.

All 3 of these programs provide important support and/or alternatives to police enforcement especially during a time when mental health challenges have been on the rise. I moved a motion to request a report on the data collected for the Gerstein Pilot thus far to help us better determine the path forward while we extend the pilot one more year.

Premium Pay

Every year, a percentage of the police budget is allocated to premium pay for the following reasons:

- extended tours of duty (e.g., when officers are involved in an arrest at the time their shift ends), (25% of premium pay);
- court attendance scheduled for when the officer is off-duty (25% of premium pay); and
- call-backs (e.g., when an officer is required to work additional shifts to ensure appropriate staffing levels are maintained or for specific initiatives). (50% of premium pay)

Due to the way shifts are organized as well as collective agreements, it is unavoidable to have to pay premium pay for extended hours and court attendance. Having more available officers would not prevent this from happening as all officers inevitably have to extend their shift or attend court beyond their scheduled hours.

The only potential savings in the future would be to increase staffing such that the need for call backs is decreased. However, there has been a multi-sectoral labour shortage which has also impacted policing. It will be difficult to strike the right balance between staffing and premium pay. It is always something that gets attention during budget time, so stay tuned! This year's police and city budget will be 2 mountains I will have to climb as a member of both the Budget Committee and Toronto Police Services Board.

There will be a Special Police Board Public Meeting on the budget on September 25, 2023, 10:00 – 11:30am. I will share how you can participate as well as other opportunities in the next newsletter.

Beyond the Blue 2nd Annual Champions of Change Awards Gala

Last night (after 8 hours at Toronto Police Services Headquarters for our board meeting), I had the privilege of attending this gala that celebrates people bringing mental health support to police and their families across Canada. You must reapply annually for the relief programs – even if you have applied for and received a cancellation, deferral, water and/or solid waste rebate for the previous year. Apply by October 31, 2023.
